Yemen celebrates International Day of the Seafarer

In his 25 June 2024 speech, Dr. Humaid emphasized seafarers' challenges, such as natural disasters, piracy, and conflict, while delivering global goods. He reaffirmed Yemen's commitment to safe working conditions and its role as chair of Working Group Two under the Jeddah Amendment to the Djibouti Code of Conduct, focused on enhancing regional capacities and promoting female inclusion in the maritime industry.

The Minister addressed the ongoing threat from the Houthi militia, which has been targeting international shipping in the Red Sea and Bab al-Mandab, causing casualties, injuries, and disrupting vital shipping routes. He strongly condemned these unlawful attacks and called for decisive action to combat such threats to maritime security.

In his speech, Captain Yeslem Mubark, Vice Executive Chairman of the Maritime Affairs Authority, underscored the crucial role of seafarers in the maritime industry, highlighting their importance and dedication in ensuring the smooth operation of global shipping.
